#### **Professor Peter St George-Hyslop**

Professor Peter St George-Hyslop is one of the world's top neurodegenerative disease researchers. His lab has discovered key genes and proteins associated with Alzheimer's Disease and has received recognition and several important awards throughout his career.

#### Dr. Luca Aiello

Dr. Luca Aiello is a Senior Research Scientist at Nokia Bell Labs in Cambridge. He is the co-founder of goodcitylife.org initiative, where he developed the Happy Maps, which uses social media to capture the ambiance of cities and build alternative map routes based on human emotions.





#### Léonie de Jonge

Léonie de Jonge is a PhD candidate at the Department of Politics and International Studies at the University of Cambridge. Her research interests include European politics, political participation, populism, and radical right parties. Léonie's talk at the Symposium will focus on Brexit.
